President's Column:

At the July club meeting, two new resolutions were passed by the membership:

- 1) Steel Targets: Metal targets can now be placed closer in front of the permanent target frames. This will allow a larger area of the pistol/rifle range to be used for Action Pistol and CAS shooting. Placement cannot be done in a way that will harm the permanent target frame wood uprights or cross-members. The membership felt that the angle of impact on the Cowboy targets would not harm these frames.
- 2) Port-a-Pottys: Finally we have better toilet facilities at both the upper and lower ranges. This was especially needed at the pistol/rifle range area. Thanks to all who voted for this. The funding for this is to initially come from the FY03-04 surplus. A more permanent funding source should be established.

We are still experiencing occasional nails on our road causing flat tires. The EC is asking the membership to record the date and any incident (vandalism/flat tire/trespassing). We have created a reporting form that will be kept at the club property for you to report the incident. Please also contact a member of the EC with any information. By compiling a list that has a member's name, date of incident and what happened, we will have something to show as evidence of our problems if we are ever fortunate enough to catch and successfully prosecute someone for such an incident.

Please remember that the gate combination will be changing at the August workparty. If you have not received your new membership card, please call or e-mail the Membership Secretary, Joe Graninger to find out why. If you don't have your new card yet and have not sent in your dues for the current year, you are in arrears.

Next month after the Club meeting on September 18th will be the annual NVSF stockholders meeting and election. Following that is our annual Hi-Power club championship. Look for a Match announcement in this issue. The following Saturday, Sept. 25, is our annual open house. You don't want to miss that. There will be plenty of food and activities for all to enjoy.

Hunting season is approaching. Please remember that hunters are required to put in four workdays to qualify for a hunting permit. The EC, along with our Hunting Chairman, Bill Howard are currently reviewing the club's hunting schedule and range closing dates. Stay tuned.

SPECIAL NOTICE:

We also request that you contact the club President, Tom Hackett, and Treasurer Darryl Breitenstein since he manages the club email list and can get notices out to our email list quickly.

Workparty Items:

RIFLE/PISTOL RANGE:

- 1. Grass cutting hand mowers and weed whackers to cut the grass around the firing line and target frame areas and along the stream banks.
- 2. Goat/DR to cut the stream bed back at least 4 ft so the tractor can mow the range.

ARCHERY RANGE:

Continue work to build & the new shooting lanes target frames - shovels, post-hole diggers etc. (See John LoBuglio for details).

SHOT GUN RANGE:

Grass cutting - hand mowers, weed whackers to cut the grass around the trap/skeet houses and fields.

PAVILION/CAMPING AREA:

Grass cutting - hand mowers, weed whackers to cut the grass.

RANGE SAFETY NOTICE REMINDERS:

- 1) MEMBERS YOU MUST PLACE TARGETS SO THAT YOU ARE SHOOTING IN A STRAIGHT LINE TO THE TARGET AND THE BULLETS ARE IMPACTING IN THE BERM. When you are firing at an angle to the target your bullets are not impacting the designed berm. The bullets may exit the range across the road or the right side of the range.
- 2) When the firing line is cold EVERYONE MUST MOVE behind the firing line so the Safety Officer has a clear view up and down the firing line.
- 3) DO NOT move any firearms to/from the firing line or handle them on the firing line when the range is cold.
- 4) Tracer and Armor-penetrating Ammunition IS NOT ALLOWED TO BE FIRED ON THE RANGE AT ANYTIME.

NOTICE: ANYONE WHO USES ANY TYPE OF METAL OR WOOD TARGET MATERIAL:

IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO REMOVE THE TARGET MATERIAL FROM THE RANGE. THE TRACTOR TIRES ARE NO MATCH FOR THIS MATERIAL. PERSISTENCE IN LEAVING ANY TYPE OF METAL OR WOOD TARGETING MATERIAL WILL NECESSITATE A RULING ON WHAT TYPE OF MATERIAL CAN BE USED ON THE RANGE.

HI POWER SERVICE RIFLE CHAMPIONSHIP

There will be a NRA Hi Power Service Rifle Match (USA) on Saturday September 18th 2004 following the work party/ meeting. Registration beings at 1100 at the rifle range or pre register by e-mail, mousegunner@earthlink.net. First shots down range at 1300.

Awards to be given for:

Grand Aggregate (club or family member only)

Hi Woman (club or family member only)

Hi Junior (club or family member only)

Award Ceremony will be September 25th at the gun club's open house at the picnic pavilion at 12:00 noon. Winners will be awarded plaques.

Cost will be \$15.00 Must supply own ammunition. Hand loads and or factory ammo authorized. No tracers or armor piercing allowed.

Course of fire will be:

10 minutes unlimited sighters on target of your choice. (target rifle A, SR 42 and MR52). Target Rifle A is a full size 200 yd. Hi power target. SR 42 is a 300 yd. Rapid fire target reduced to 200 yd. MR 52 is a 600 yd slow fire target reduced to 200 yd.

Match 1 - 200 yards slow fire standing, (off hand). Ten shots slow fire in time limit of 10 minutes. Target will be Target Rifle A.

Match 2- 200 yards sitting to sitting rapid fire. Ten shots time limit 60 seconds, loading 2 magazines with 2 and 8 rounds. Target will be Target Rifle A.

Match 3- 300 yards prone to prone rapid fire. Ten shots time limit 70 seconds. loading 2 magazines with 2 and 8 rounds. Target will be SR 42.

Match 4- 600 yards slow fire prone 20 shots time limit 20 minutes. Target will be MR 52.

Scoring will be done by individual competitors after the completion of Match 1 and 2, and Match 3 and 4.

Shotgun Range News:

We had a number of shooters participate in the Battlefield Open Skeet Match in Fredericksburg, where a record 138 shooters competed. Our best effort was Jason Falbe's 97 with his twelve gauge, winning a class medal. Jon Yagla's 94 in doubles at all stations got him in a shoot off with three other competitors, but he choked early and had to pack it up. Falbe just ran 75 in practice and is ready for prime time. Regularly scheduled practices have been badly compromised by afternoon thunderstorms, but we were able to off load 315 cases of targets one hot afternoon. Thanks for turning out for this hard work.

See the match bulletin at the end of this newsletter about our Jambalaya Open match taking place on September 10-12. This is our third match. We are trying to control costs. We may need volunteers to help! We will start on time. The club has two fields with new and very reliable Beomat traps. The fields are lighted. There is no clubhouse, but there is a large picnic shelter with electrical outlets and picnic tables. There is a new pavilion for shooters and spectators behind each range. Camper hookups may be available.

Club Shotgun Match:

We will have a club match starting at 8 a.m. on Saturday, August 14. This will be for the club shotgun championship, with handicapping to equalize the competition. The champion will receive a silver collector coin, lots of hype in the newsletter, and bragging rights. The course of fire will be 50 targets of skeet, 25 trap singles, and 25 trap handicap. Additional strings will be fired as time and weather permit. This event is also approved by NSSA for those wishing to register scores.

NSSA Shotgun Match:

We have applied for a NSSA registered skeet match on 10,11, and 12 September. As during the Einbinder Appreciation Match in April, practice shooters will be accommodated to the best of our ability.
