Range Safety Committee:

Work Day project for June:

There are still a large number of downed trees to be cut into saw logs. This can be a project for the June work party. It will require the three members for each team: 1 member with a chain saw; two members with a 16 foot tape measure and one ax to mark the logs.

GENERAL MAINTENANCE:

The shoulders along the road to the range have a number of trees and tree limbs that are over hanging in the road. This will require pruning shears to cut back overhanging tree branches along the road and side lines on the ranges; Be sure to cut the trees low to the ground so the tractor will be able to cut the road side.

Weed Wackers and/or push lawn mowers to trim the slope in front of the rifle/pistol ranges; around the target frames; camp grounds; shotgun range and picnic area;

Pickup Truck with King George county sticker to make the usual trash run to the dump;

Saws, hammers, etc to rebuild the damage target covers on the archery range;

RANGE SAFETY NOTICE REMINDERS:

- 1) MEMBERS YOU MUST PLACE TARGETS SO THAT YOU ARE SHOOTING IN A STRAIGHT LINE TO THE TARGET AND THE BULLETS ARE IMPACTING IN THE BERM. When you are firing at an angle to the target your bullets are not impacting the designed berm. The bullets may exit the range across the road or the right side of the range.
- 2) When the firing line is cold EVERYONE MUST MOVE behind the firing line so the Safety Officer has a clear view up and down the firing line.
- 3) DO NOT move any firearms to/from the firing line or handle them on the firing line when the range is cold.
- 4) Tracer Ammunition IS NOT ALLOWED TO BE FIRED ON THE RANGE AT ANYTIME. Thank you for following these safety rules.

Shotgun News: The trap and skeet ranges have been very busy since the cold, windy weather went back up North where it belongs. We usually have full squads of both trap and skeet shooters, and a few waiting their turn. Some shooters are cooking their supper after the shooting. We have approval to build two shooters pavilions behind the skeet fields. We will commence construction the first week of June, and hopefully finish the buildings at our monthly work session, in time for the picnic, swap meet and shooting activities. We will work in the evenings, and finish up with a little shooting. Gene Hodgson finished the stairs to the new high house. They look great!

There will be an ATA Trap Match, Sunday, June 20, at 9 a.m. We have trap and skeet "targets only" every Wednesday during our regular practice sessions. Shooters needing to get classified, attain minimums for state and national competition, and wanting to improve their averages can do so for the cost of registering their scores.

Some recent highlights: Brian Green was in the winner's circle at the state sporting clays tournament in May. Richard Toothman ran 200 trap doubles and 100 singles to win a shoot in West Virginia. Frank Baker ran 50 straight in trap practice last week, and Jon Yagla broke a 96 in handicap trap in our last ATA match.

We shoot every Wednesday at 4:30. However, there are shooters coming in and shooting a few rounds almost every day of the week. There is also usually a good a turnout on Sunday afternoons.
