## **Custom Molded Ear Plugs:**

Highlights: Jeff Jones and Rich Toothman ran 100 straights on the same squad in late June. Rich just cleaned a Big 50 course of fire with 50 straights in 16 yard, handicap (25 yards for Rich) and 50 doubles. Our Two-Day ATA Match in June showed our progress: The first day bulletin shows Phil Bushong in the lead with a 96 at 16 yards and an 89, tied with Frank Baker, at handicap. A quick 10 target shoot off went to Phil. Jon Yagla posted 98 in doubles, which was just enough to pull out in front for High Overall with a 276. ## BASIC NORTHERN VIRGINIA GUN CLUB ARCHERY RANGE RULES

- 1. Only Field Points and Target Points are to be used on the Excelsior bales and 3-D targets. Broadheads, crossbows and bolts are prohibited. Broadheads are only authorized for use on special designated Styrofoam, Eythofoam or similar targets that are specifically designed for Broadhead use. This type of target is not provided by the club or allowed to be set up on the Walk-Through Range.
- 2. Notify all archers at your station, before moving forward to pull arrows. Arrows are not to be nocked while anyone is forward of the shooting line.
- 3. Archers must be 18 years of age or supervised by a qualified adult.
- Place practice targets in various spots on bale faces to equalize wear and avoid shooting at one area for all practice shots.
- 5. Paper testing may be done on target # 1 only.
- 6. Check your equipment. Make any necessary repairs and adjustments behind the shooting line. Mark any location of broken arrows or points that remain in the targets.
- 7. Do not handle another archer's equipment without their permission.
- 8. No shooting at target frames; do not place targets in front of frames.
- 9. Conduct that may endanger range safety is strictly prohibited.
- 10. Leave the range in better condition than you found it. Police your garbage.
- 11. Report all violations to the Archery Chairman or a club officer.



## Northern Virginia Gun Club NVGC Proposed Hunting Regulations (06/2005)

- 1. All Virginia Game Commission Regulations apply at the club.
- 2. Hunters must have a valid Club Hunting Permit. Four work party credits are required in order to be issued a Club Hunting Permit. Contact the hunting chairman or one of the other club officers after you have finished getting your work party credits in order to get a permit.
- 3. The shotgun and pistol/rifle ranges will remain open during all hunting seasons. Hunters are responsible for knowing the location of the range impact areas and avoiding them when shooting is in session. The boundaries of the impact areas have been delineated by trees marked with orange paint and/or signs. One or two stations from the archery range will be open for target shooting. The remainder of the archery range will be available for hunting. These areas will be marked.
- 4. No new permanent treestands are to be constructed. Existing permanent stands are club property and can be used by hunters on a first come, first serve basis. Hunters may place ladder stands and other stands at their preferred locations. However, placing a treestand at a spot in the woods does not reserve that area. If another hunter wants to hunt in that vicinity and arrives there first, the hunter with the ladder stand must hunt somewhere else (unless a cordial mutual agreement can be arranged). The gun club land is not personal property. Portable treestands (the kind you carry in and out each session) are allowed and encouraged.
- 5. Unfortunately, no guests are allowed to hunt at the club. As immediate family members are associate members of NVGC, they are permitted to hunt with NVGC members on the property. Members are responsible for their supervision.
- 6. Hunters wishing to camp on the property during hunting season must camp only in the designated camping areas near the skeet field.
- 7. Hunters are encouraged to identify their vehicles as belonging to NVGC members. A suggested method would be to copy your hunting permit and display it on your dashboard.
- 8. All hunters must park only at designated points on the property (See the map below). These points are as follows: a. Skeet field / camping area; b. Adjacent to (inside or outside) the NVGC front gate at Rt. 218; c. Rifle & pistol range parking lot; d. Power line clearing at Rt. 218 (outside gate to Bashoor property). Don't block the driveway; e. Power line clearing at Rt. 218 at east end of Bashoor property.
- 9. Hunters are required to record game taken in the logbook kept at the skeet field. The logbook will be kept in the skinning shed (the one with the built-in picnic table). The combination will be the first digits of the gate combination.
- 10. Remove all your trash from the property. We have no work parties November thru February to empty the trash barrels. Hunters are required to pack out their trash upon breaking camp.
- 11. All Terrain Vehicles (ATVs) are not permitted for hunting on the property.
- 12. Good luck, and good hunting!
