Much work was completed in October thanks to all those who contributed their time and energy to volunteer. Your efforts do make a difference and the organization is able to function and provide services to our members. Without volunteers, the organization would not be able to survive.

Please mark your calendar that the <u>November club meeting</u> has been re-scheduled to <u>Sunday Nov. 20<sup>th</sup>, 05 from 1-2 PM at the Gander Mountain Lodge</u> meeting room at Gander Mtn. on Rte 3 in Fredericksburg. This change was made to accommodate the many members who like to hunt on the opening day of the general firearms season which is the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sat., Nov. 19th. Nominations will be made for the Executive Committee positions at the November meeting and elections will take place at the December meeting.

Also, the **December club meeting** is scheduled for **Sunday Dec. 18<sup>th</sup>**, **05 at 12 Noon at the Old King George Elementary School** on St. Anthony's Rd. just off of Rte 3 approximately ½ mile east of Rte 3 & 206 junction. Election of Club Officers for the new year will take place at this meeting.

I'd like to inform the membership that the King George County "Draft" Comprehensive Plan for 2005 was announced in a front-page article of the King George Journal dated Oct. 5<sup>th</sup>, 2005. That article came to my attention on Friday Oct. 7<sup>th</sup> and indicated that the draft update to the new 5 year King George County Draft Comprehensive Plan for 2005 contained several direct and indirect references to acquiring the abandoned CSX Railroad Right-of-Way (RROW) property to promote utility and recreational uses. This was in direct conflict with the Board of Supervisors unanimous motion "To delete all references for acquiring and use of the RROW in the Comprehensive Plan for roadway, utilities, and recreational use" as passed in May of 2000 before ratification of the Comprehensive Plan of 2000. The article announced that a public hearing for comments to revisions contained in the draft KG County Comprehensive Plan 2005 would be held on Tue. Oct. 11<sup>th</sup> at 7 PM which gave us only 4 days to organize a protest at the meeting to oppose the issue. The response was amazing. We had a full house in the audience. Around 55-60 folks and  $\sim 90\%$  were there in support of our issue to again delete all reference to the abandoned CSX Railroad property referred to as the RROW. Only two persons were in attendance to show support for the trail. I was surprised to even hear a bicyclist voicing her support for our position. About a dozen club members were in attendance as listed (Bob King \*, Ernie Jones \*, Cliff Byrum \*, John LoBuglio\*, Tim Carsola, Darryl Breitenstein, Howard & Rhea Stickley, Mark Varney, Charles Philbrick, Nancy Depoy, Greg Thorsted) (\* Spoke in opposition). I hope I haven't left anyone out, but if I have, I apologize and thank all for coming out. Our show of force and voicing opinion impressed the commission and

indicated this is a controversial and sensitive issue to many KG residents. A coordinated effort brought out a good cross section of other supporters who had been contacted. There were a number of farm owners, Meadows residents, Huggar Tract residents, members of the Little Ark Baptist Church and others in attendance besides our membership along with a Republican endorsement, so it was a very good cross section of county residents in attendance showing support for our side of the issue. Even though there was complete agreement to delete any direct or inferred reference, we need to be vigilant to follow-up and ensure it happens and always be on the lookout until it comes to a final settlement once and for all.

#### **Hunting News:**

The fall hunting season is here and those members who have fulfilled the 4 workday requirement can contact the Hunt Chairman, John Klochak for their hunting permit. John will only issue permits to those members who have fulfilled their workparty requirements as identified on attached list.

A reminder that hunters need to follow all state law and club regulations when hunting on facility property. No guests are allowed to hunt on club property and family members must be accompanied and in visual site of the club member when hunting. It is advisable that any non-hunters venturing outside the picnic and range areas during these seasons wear bright colors.

This year constitutes the longest deer season allowed according to the state formula for calculating the hunting seasons. The firearms Season begins on Sat. Nov. 19th and ends on the first Saturday in January this season, which falls on January 7th, 2006. If you have any questions, visit the VA State DGIF website: http://www.dgif.virginia.gov/index.asp for more information.

As a safety precaution when hunting with a crossbow, do not walk around with it cocked and loaded with a bolt (crossbow term for arrow). When walking, you can have cable cocked, but keep the bolt in a protected quiver until you are in your stand or blind. This should apply wherever you may hunt and not just on the club property.

As a note, Crossbows are not allowed for use on the archery range to shoot at the excelsior bales. You will be allowed to bring your own stand-alone crossbow target to shoot at on the archery range provided that you do not use the excelsior bales as a backstop.

#### Range Safety in light of Range Maintenance and Tracking Wounded Game:

An issue was raised at the August Gun Club meeting concerning range procedures for conducting range maintenance and tracking and recovery of wounded game. This was raised during discussions of the 05-06 Club Hunting regulations. The following paragraphs discuss each of these issues separately.

Range Maintenance: Range maintenance falls under the Executive Officer per the By-Laws, and historically, the maintenance is conducted during the monthly work parties. On a few occasions, such as prior to scheduled matches, some short notice maintenance has needed to be completed, and has been handled on a case by case basis. I am not aware of archery range maintenance outside of the normal work party cycle, but perhaps the Archery Chairman can explain what procedures were used if such out of cycle maintenance was conducted. Shotgun range maintenance has utilized an orange safety cone to indicate when maintenance is being conducted in the Trap House, and the Skeet Houses have had their power secured at the breaker box when maintenance was

conducted there. Rifle and Pistol range maintenance outside of the normal cycle has had notifications in the newsletters, and signs and tape to indicate maintenance was ongoing. Further, maintenance is generally in plain view of the firing line, the exception being the far end of the 200 yd rifle area. Cutting the range grass is probably the most common maintenance that has occurred on other than monthly work parties, and the tractor cutting grass has so far been pretty hard to overlook. I suggest that whoever is mowing the grass at the far end of the 200 yard rifle range not linger there, but make cuts that bring him frequently into view of the rest of the firing line. The Executive Office may want to review the scheduling of maintenance, with an eye toward all maintenance being conducted during the regular work parties. The 05-06 Hunting regulations would seem to have no impact on the club's current maintenance procedures.

Tracking and Recovery of Wounded Game: This topic seems to be a new issue this year, until one realizes that the ranges have never been closed for archery and muzzleloader seasons since these seasons came into existence, and no special procedures have ever been required. Wounded deer have been most likely to head for the swamp than the impact areas, and I don't believe it will be different during the shotgun season. Discussions during the August Gun Club meeting suggested a flag system to indicate the range was cold. The discussion also quickly identified one problem with such a system in that we did not have a common, intuitive understanding of what a red flag meant. Those with a military background consider the range HOT with a red flag is raised. Those of a civilian background thought red meant the range was closed. A cone system was suggested, as were posting of signs, particularly by methods that would physically block access to the range.

Solution: In considering these alternatives, each with their own drawbacks, one answer that was overlooked is how we currently control the ranges. By our current rules, the ranges are controlled by a member of the range safety committee, or, if one is not present, the club members select one of their number to act as the range officer. If a hunter needs to enter the impact area, he would contact the range officer controlling that range. In the cases where the range is not in use and no range officer is present, the hunter would have to provide a range officer (a range safety committee member or another selected club member as in normal range operations) to control the range while he is searching for his wounded deer and in the impact area. This places the burden on the hunter in the areas of the club where ranges are located. This would seem appropriate since, by keeping the ranges open during the hunting seasons, the club is stating the principal activity in this area is range firing. Likewise, hunting is the principal activity from the logging road and eastward, and in the new 45 acre additional property, since there are no ranges located here to hamper hunting.

The above solution was presented by the Hunting and Range Safety Committee Chairmen, and accepted by the NVGC Executive Committee at their 15 September 2005 meeting.

#### **Custom Molded Ear Plugs:**

I have been able to re-establish myself as a dealer for the E.A.R.custom molded ear plugs. These are the best, most comfortable ear plugs I have ever found, plus the sound protection can be up to 33 NRR. I am currently using a set I made for high power shooting 20 years ago, so I know they last a long time. Enough people expressed an interest, so I ordered the supplies, and have them on hand. I can make your custom molded ear plugs with carrying case for \$25. The process takes about 20-25 minutes, and requires that you not talk or move your jaw for about 15 minutes as the material sets up. The plugs are useable the next day. #### Shotgun Range.

We've had such a great year, with dozens of shooters having a good time all summer, and the competitors shooting some really fine scores in big matches all across the country.

On the negative side, I have something I want you all to think about and help each other with. First is the equipment. The machines cost us about \$24,000. They belong to all of us. We need to take good care of them. Besides the normal wear and tear, which we expect, there has been some outright abuse. We had a skeet shooter trying shoot alone by releasing the targets by stepping on the switches. The next bunch of shooters reported they

couldn't shoot because the high house and doubles switches didn't work. I took the release handle apart and it had dirt ground into to it. The handle was just replaced this spring for \$78. I just replaced the trap throwing arm twice. They were severely bent and cost \$32 each. This is from trying to throw targets when the machine is jammed. One guy was standing there shooting at the biggest pieces. Anyway, at \$2/round with a very small margin of profit, it will take hundreds of rounds of shooting to pay for these parts. If four in row come out broken, cease firing and clear the machine. There is a process in place: I can bill a shooter for any parts and labor to make a repair. The EC will back this up and take any additional action they deem appropriate. Better yet, the shooter should just come forward and pay for any damage.

Finally, the targets belong to the shooters. There is no NVGC or NVSF money involved. The shooters pay for the targets they shoot and use the money to buy new ones. It is very important that *every* shooter pay *every* time for *every* target. They \$2/25 or 8 cents each. Target manufacturing costs are up, delivery cost is up, and it will be very hard to hold this price unless *every* one pays.
