From the XO:

My sincere thanks to everyone who came out to help at the June work party! Your generous donation of time and effort is what helps our club running efficiently, safely and looking good.

FUNDED PROJECTS: Several work projects funded by the NVGC and/or NFSF are ongoing and making significant progress toward improving our ranges and facilities. Sisson Excavating continues work to deliver additional dirt and build-up the 200 yd berm. I anticipate that task will be completed during July. I have already noted significant soil erosion at the base of the 100 yd berm and am working with the Shooting Facility leadership to resolve best course of action. Walt Beer has excavated and installed the septic field for the future kitchen/bathroom facility. And the shooting facility has authorized \$2,000 for procurement and spreading of crushed concrete/gravel to address the washout conditions on several sections of the range road. This additional gravel will be placed in early Jul.

WORK PARTY: The next work party is scheduled for 19 Jul, 0900-1200 hrs.

The following projects will be undertaken:

- 1. Cleaning gutters on lower range: Bring 20 foot ladders, leaf blowers, hand rakes, and drain snakes.
- 2. Target support repair: Bring battery operated drills/drivers/saws, 8 foot step ladders.
- 3. Roadside clearing: Bring chain saws, loppers, pole saws.
- 4. Grass and weed trimming: Bring week wackers and fuel.

WANTED: In order to save the club money on future projects, I am interested in hearing from any club members who have a lead on:

- 1. Free or deep discounted pressure treated lumber (4x4, 6x6, 1x4, 2x6-2x10)
- 2. Skill and tools for finishing concrete slab.
- 3. Free construction materials to donate to the future kitchen/bathroom (e.g. framing lumber, sheathing, roofing materials, plumbing materials and fixtures, electrical supplies and fixtures, kitchen appliances)

WORK CREDITS: Cumulative work credits thru 6 Jul for calendar year 2008 are listed in attached spreadsheet. Please contact me directly before the end of each month to register any of your work credits and I will update the spreadsheet. Should you note any errors, just let me know and I will correct. Please keep in mind that new members and hunters are required to work at least four credits per year.

Range Safety Notes:

These months notes are pretty much a repeat of last month. I went to the rifle range to practice after the picnic and I am pleased to report that folks are observing the basic safety rules and procedures that are stated below.

One point that I would like to add; if you choose to bring your dog, please keep your furry friend on a leash, loud noise, gunfire, can easily upset a dog, if your dog does not take to the loud noise, please get the dog away from the immediate shooting area. Please clean up after your pet; I have observed some droppings on the ranges, and listened to complaints.

Work is continuing on the 200 yard berm; the target shed will be rebuilt and target frames will also be rebuilt after all berm work has been completed

There is a extra lock in the ammo can that used to house the radios in the target frame shed at the rifle/pistol range, if anyone has problems with the gate lock, use the extra and let any EC member know that the lock has been replaced.

Please practice basic safety, **EYE** and **EAR** protection required on the line while shooting is in progress on the lower ranges, forward of the light poles on the skeet and trap ranges.

I want to see everyone practice range safety on a daily basis while at the range. If you are the first person shooting, then you are the Range Safety Officer (RSO) for the range. If there is a group, the group should appoint someone to be the RSO; when that person leaves the range, he/she shall appoint another person, and so on until the last person or group leaves for the day. When a "cease fire" is called, stop firing, remove the magazine and clear your weapon, place the weapon on the bench with bolt / slide open. Take items such as glasses, drinks, etc. with you and step back from the line; at no time during a "cease fire" are you permitted to touch your weapon or the bench for any reason.

I have gotten a number of complaints about people fooling with weapons and items on the line after a "cease fire" has been called, I will expect the acting RSO to put a stop to this practice. I don't want to see someone injured, or worse, by carelessness; I don't know of anyone who would want to injure a friend or family member.

People are still putting rounds through the **TOP** cross members on all of the ranges. In most cases these rounds are clearing the berms and going into the trees. **Target frames are to be used for holding target backers, not clay pigeons, cans plastic bottles, balloons etc.** Staple balloons to target backers if you shoot balloons, hang plastic bottles, etc. with a string from a cross member. **DO NOT** lean anything against an upright to shoot at, build your own frame and set up **in front** of a berm, be sure that your rounds **impact the berm**, please avoid shooting into the ground. Rounds can ricochet and clear the top of the berm, this has been observed recently on the 25 yard pistol range.

If you remove stools or benches from under the covered part of the line please put them back when finished. Someone put time and effort into building this equipment for the club, YOUR CLUB, so take care of YOUR stuff.

If you see anyone deliberately destroying club property, report the person or persons to any one of the Executive Committee or any member of the Facility Board.

Please pick up your targets and take them with you when you are finished shooting; if you can bring it you can certainly take it with you and dispose of it.

With warm weather upon us you may see people using the trail and the bypass, our road. Drive slow to and from the lower ranges and be courteous to anyone walking on the road.

Speaking of warm weather, don't forget the bug spray, and keep an eye out for snakes.
